A veteran of Operation Desert Storm, Moy was a 14-year member of the security team at Scottsdale Healthcare. Aside from his devotion to his family, he was an avid rider and member of a local Christian motorcycle club. Tragically, Moy died what he loved — riding his motorcy-

In early 2009, Moy had a vision to organize a poker run to support the Gift of Life Lodging Program at the Virginia G. Piper Cancer Center.

Through the help of his colleagues, family and friends, the poker run carries on with his vision.

The poker run begins and ends at Casino Arizona, Loop 101 and McKellips Road.
