Neighborhood Outreach Action for Health

The NOAH program provides the following services to patients:

- Primary care for eligible children and their parents may include
 - Physical exams
 - Diagnosis and treatment of minor illnesses
 - Health education
 - Sports physicals
 - Well child exams
 - Medical referrals
- Prenatal care for mothers of eligible children through referral to Scottsdale Healthcare Heuser Family Practice Center
- Cervical cancer screening through referral to Scottsdale Healthcare Heuser Family Practice Center
- Diabetes Disease State Management Clinics
- Dental Screening and follow-up care for eligible children
- Community Health Services

NOAH Clinics

The NOAH clinics provide health care services to uninsured and underserved children, as well as their immediate family members, who reside in the Scottsdale and Paradise Valley Unified School Districts.

Fees

Patients may pay a small co-pay for primary care visits, referral services and prescription medications. Co-pays are based on income and ability to pay.

NOAH Mobile Health Unit

Staffed with nurse practitioners and other health care professionals, this unique mobile health unit brings health care, education, services and screenings to schools, seniors, businesses and community organizations. NOAH Prenatal

Eligible patients can receive referrals to Scottsdale Healthcare's Heuser Family Practice Center through NOAH's prenatal program.

The Heuser Family Practice Center will provide the following prenatal services to eligible women:

- Prenatal care visits
- One ultrasound
- Routine laboratory work
- Nutritional services
- One visit after delivery

Hospital Delivery

The NOAH Prenatal program does not cover the cost of delivery services at Scottsdale Healthcare Hospitals. Scottsdale Healthcare hospitals require all prenatal program patients to obtain AHCCCS services for delivery. NOAH staff members will assist women in applying for these services.

NOAH Cervical Cancer Screening Program

NOAH clinics can provide referrals to eligible patients for an annual pap smear and pelvic examination.
